



Dear Mr. Zoorhis:

Your complaint regarding Corporate Compliance was given to me. I am the attorney assigned the task of resolving issues with Corporate Compliance. As you may have read, we have sued Corporate Compliance. As a result of this lawsuit, we have entered into negotiations with their counsel.

While this matter has not yet been settled, you should know that the basics of any negotiation with Corporate Compliance involve getting your money back. Immediately after we sued Corporate Compliance, we entered into a temporary agreement with them that kept all the mail in their Tallahassee Postal Box on the premises. For most people this means that Corporate Compliance has not received nor deposited your checks. If our negotiations are successful, you will receive your check and mailing back from Corporate Compliance. Other businesses who promptly responded to the Corporate Compliance advertisement had their check cashed. For these people we are seeking a complete refund of those moneys. The negotiations are ongoing; I speak with their counsel regularly. We anticipate arriving at a settlement which will include a complete refund of your money. Obviously, no settlement is final until signed, and if negotiations fail we will proceed with the already filed lawsuit seeking a complete refund of your money.

Assuming that we reach a resolution of this case through negotiation, no further action on your part will be needed. You will automatically receive your original check back, or if it has already been cashed, you will receive a check from Corporate Compliance.
