Dear Mr. DUNLAP:

I wish to thank you very much for your time and your courtesy on the phone again yesterday. We fully realize that the FLORIDA SECRETARY OF STATE, having thousands of corporations to attend, could not give this sort of cooperation to each one that finds itself afoul of the rules regarding ANNUAL REPORTS. And, I myself have had the unpleasant responsibility, on a few occasions in the past, of being forced to convey your message to clients who, for one reason or another, did not comply.

However, I very much feel that this case represents an exception, for the reasons already stated. And thanks to our conversation yesterday, I confess that better appreciate your position, in the absence of my October 29, 1999 letter.

Please consider the facts surrounding that (apparently missing) correspondence: On September 18, 1999, I entered PLANTATION GENERAL HOSPITAL for major surgery. The surgery itself lasted over six (6) hours and I was confined to bed for a period of three (3) months thereafter. In January, 2000, I was permitted to walk with the benefit of crutches, which were required until just a few weeks ago.

In October, while I was still confined to bed, I learned, by telephone, of a problem with the FEIN. I telephoned the DIVISION OF CORPORATIONS and was issued some instructions and my letter of October 29, is consistent with the same. Having dictated, read, signed and had the letter mailed, I thought the issue was then at rest. I was amazed to learn from you yesterday, that you never received that (10/29/99) letter. We no longer have the printer upon which that letter was prepared.

I had not yet returned to my office when you apparently sent your November letter. I, personally, never received that letter, and I, personally, have never read the letter; I know, only from you, what it contains. As it just occurred to me, the precise date upon which it was sent is also not known to me, and so I can only speculate as to what transpired concerning the same..

In that regard, I can only assume that, (if we did receive your November letter while I was still confined to bed), someone here may have thought that our letters, "crossed in the mails," as the expression goes; that is, that I furnished a response to the problem prior to your formally advising me of the same; and that, therefore, no further response was required by us. I can only guess at this point; I can't be sure, since I haven't read yours. But, my October letter may have seemed so close to addressing the underlying issue itself, that if yours was received, someone may have thought that we already corrected the error to your satisfaction. The secretary who assisted me while I was recovering was a "part-time" employee and has since moved to Atlanta. I would rather not involve her in this matter, however, I am certain that she could be located and that she could write to you directly, if it will help.

Permit me to be somewhat repetitious, and conclude by saying that my client clearly ATTEMPTED to act conscientiously in this matter, to wit: (a) they mailed their ANNUAL REPORT on time, (b) they notified you of the change of address for their designated representative, in a reasonable (if not precisely correct) manner, by indicating the same in the only box which is characterized by the word "NEW," (c) the firm's check was accepted and cashed by your office, and (d) that the only error in the entire filing is the jinxed, unfortunate, and the certainly unintended, surplus digit, "4."

Through the failure various mechanisms thereafter, this digit has spiraled into an awesome fine; a fine which is in an amount that represents, most truly, an acute and severe burden for the fledgling enterprise which I represent.

As such, we respectfully contend, this is an appropriate situation where the ANNUAL REPORT should be simply considered filed, as of the date it was first received by your office. In conformity with your requirements, you kindly requested correction of the FEIN, and we have complied, without serious damage to anyone or any entity.


