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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF AMERICAN FEDERATION OF ANCIENT HELLENIC GAMES, INC. 23 PM 4: 44

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation under the Florida General SECRETARY UP STATE TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA Corporation Act, hereby adopts the following articles of incorporation:

ARTICLE ONE NAME

The name of the corporation is AMERICAN FEDERATION OF ANCIENT HELLENIC GAMES, INC.

ARTICLE TWO DURATION

The term of existence of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE THREE PURPOSE

This corporation is organized for the purposes of operating as a special event coordinator, developer, and promoter for the Ancient Olympian Games, sport and cultural events and all other purposes for which a corporation may be incorporated under the Florida General Corporation Act, with a focus on the following objectives:

- 1. To develop and promote the Ancient Olympian Games, sports, and culture (from 776 BC to 393 AD) in the American society.
- 2. To coordinate, promote and support the organizations, associations, schools, academies, colleges, universities, clubs and other groups that are involved in the development of the Ancient Olympian Games working together in harmony in American communities and around the world (kinonia).
- 3. To organize, promote, and support the Ancient Olympian Games in the Ûnited States of America.
- 4. To organize the qualification events for the selection of the best talents and teams to represent the United States of America in the Ancient Olympian Games held at their birthplace, Olympia City of Hellas, or anywhere else in the world.
- 5. To preserve and promote the true Ancient Olympian Spirit of a healthier body, mind and soul.

- 6. To teach, develop, and promote the Ancient Olympian Games, sports and culture such as:
 - a. AGONISMA DROMON (Running) Stadion, Diaulos, Ippios, Dolichos
 - b. HOPLITIS DROMOS (Race in Armor)
 - c. PALI (Ancient Style Wrestling)
 - d. PIGME (Ancient Style Boxing)
 - e. PANKRATION (Ancient Self Defense Sport)
 - f. PENTATHLON Dromos, Alma, Akontio, Discus, and Pali
 - g. ALMA (Ancient Style Jumping)
 - h. AKONTISMOS (Javelin throwing)
 - i. DISCOBOLIA (Discus throwing)
 - j. HIPODROMIES (Horse racing) Keles, Foals, and Mares
 - k. ARMATODROMIES (Chariot races) Tethrippon, Synoris, Tethrippon Polon, Syronis Polon and Apene
 - 1. AGONES KIPIKON AND SALPIGTON (Contests for Heralds and Trumpets)
 - m. TA HERAEA (Foot races for Girls)
- 7. To develop academies and centers (gymnasteria) for education on the Ancient Olympian Games, sports, and culture in the United States of America.
- 8. To organize local, state and national competitions, championships and festivals for the development and promotion of the Ancient Olympian Games.
- 9. To select and develop Hellanodikas (Judges) for the Ancient Olympian Games.
- 10. To develop a national logo, banners, forms, certificates, awards, and other items of the federation for the promotion and recognition of its members, participants, and the games.
- 11. To cooperate with municipalities, communities, state and national government agencies for the best interest of the federation, its members, and its participants for the development of the Ancient Olympian Games.
- 12. To organize the promotion of the Ancient Olympian Games through the mass communications media, seminars, conferences, newspapers, newsletters, periodicals, and other events throughout the United States of America and the world.
- 13. To offer memberships of various levels and to be a member of organizations supporting the Ancient Olympian Games.
- 14. To perform any other relative activity that shall contribute to the development of the Ancient Olympian Games, art, sports, performing arts, and dance, for the accomplishment of any of the above.

American Federation of Ancient Olympian Games, Inc. is established for the purpose of organizing, promoting, and developing in harmony, the Ancient Olympian Games, and will not involve or interfere with politics in any nation, or organizations' internal affairs.

ARTICLE FOUR CAPITAL STOCK

The aggregate number of shares that the corporation has authority to issue is 1000 shares of no par value common stock.

ARTICLE FIVE PREEMPTIVE RIGHTS GRANTED

Each shareholder of any class of stock of this corporation shall be entitled to full preemptive rights to purchase any unissued or treasury shares of the corporation and any securities of the corporation convertible into or carrying a right to subscribe to or acquire any unissued or treasury shares.

ARTICLE SIX STOCK TRANSFER RESTRICTIONS

No transfer of stock shall be valid, until ten days after the corporation, through its secretary, shall have had written notice of the proposed sale, the number of shares proposed to be sold, the price at which the proposed sale is to be made, and the name of the prospective buyer. During such ten days, the corporation shall have the option to buy at the price set by seller any shares of outstanding stock, before its owner or the person in whose name it stands on the books of the corporation, may transfer them. Should the corporation not have the funds to buy the shares, or should it deem it undesirable to purchase them for any other reason, another existing shareholder shall have the option, for an additional ten days, of purchasing the shares at the price set by the seller in proportion to the number of shares then held by the shareholder. In the event a dispute exists between the shareholders and the corporation in regards to the fair market value of the shares, the fair market value will be determined by binding arbitration. In no event may the

shares be sold to a third party without the written consent of the Board of Directors. However, the Board of Directors may not unreasonably refuse to allow the sale of shares to a third party.

ARTICLE SEVEN TRANSFER EXCEPTIONS

Not withstanding anything herein to the contrary, any shareholder may at any time during such shareholder's lifetime transfer any of such shareholder's share in the company to his or her spouse, father or mother, children (unless those children have not reached their age of majority, in which event the shareholder may transfer the stock in trust for the benefit of such minor children) or to the trustee or trustees under any trust created during his or her lifetime for the benefit of the shareholder, his or her spouse, father or mother, or children. However, the spouse, father, mother, children or trustee shall agree in writing prior to such transfer to become a party to and be bound by all the terms and conditions of the agreement which provides for the corporation's option to purchase shares before sale to other stockholders or third persons, just as if they were original parties to such agreement.

ARTICLE EIGHT REGISTERED OFFICE

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 483 Mandalay Ave. Ste 206, Clearwater Beach, FL 33767 and, the name of the initial registered agent is Socrates Charos.

ARTICLE NINE MANNER OF ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The manner in which the directors are elected or appointed is as follows:

Upon proper notice, the Bylaws may be amended, altered or rescinded by a majority vote of those members of the Board of Directors present at its regular meeting or special meeting called for that purpose. Providing that notification of the meeting also includes the notice of the proposed amendment to the Bylaws, and provided that a quorum is present.

ARTICLE TWELVE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

- 1. The Corporation may amend these Articles of Incorporation for the conduct of its business and the carrying out of its purposes, as they may deem necessary from time to time.
- 2. Upon proper notice, the Articles may be amended by a majority of those members of the Board of Directors present at the regular meeting or special meeting called for that purpose, providing that the notification of the meeting also includes the notice of the proposed amendment to the Articles and provided that a quorum is present.
