#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned incorporator, a natural person of legal age, for the purpose of forming a corporation in accordance with the Florida Business Corporation Act, Chapter 607, Florida Statutes, hereby subscribes to, acknowledges and adopts the following Articles of Incorporation.

### ARTICLE I

The name of the proposed corporation shall be THE CLASSICAL MUSES, INC.

### ARTICLE II Duration

This corporation shall commence existence on the date of the execution and acknowledgment of these Articles, or on filing of these Articles if that shall occur more than five days thereafter, and shall exist perpetually thereafter, unless sooner dissolved according to law.

## ARTICLE III Nature of Business

This Corporation is formed for the following purposes and shall have the following powers:

- 1. To engage in any lawful business and to own, lease and/or operate offices for that purpose.
- 2. To own real and personal property, to enter into contracts and agreements necessary or appropriate in the pursuit of such lawful business.

3. To do everything necessary, proper or convenient for the accomplishment of the purposes set forth herein, and to do every other act incidental thereto which is not forbidden under the laws of the State of Florida or by the provisions of these Articles of Incorporation.

# ARTICLE IV Capital Stock

This corporation is authorized to issue 1,000 shares of ONE AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$1.00) par value capital stock, which shall be designated as common stock.

All the shares of such common stock shall be issued for consideration consisting of any tangible or intangible property or benefit to the corporation, including cash, promissory notes, services performed, promises to perform services evidenced by a written contract, or other securities of the corporation, at a just valuation to be fixed by the Board of Directors of the corporation, unless otherwise forbidden by the laws of the State of Florida. The corporation shall place shares issued for future services or benefits or a promissory note in escrow or otherwise restrict their transfer and shall credit distributions in respect of such shares against their purchase price, until the services are performed, the If the services are not note is paid or the benefits received. performed, the note is not paid or the benefits are not received, the shares escrowed or restricted and the distributions credited shall be canceled in whole or part, as appropriate based on the THE CLASSICAL MUSES, INC. # ARTICLE V Initial Offices and Registered Agent

The street and mailing address of the initial principal office of this corporation is 309 S. Lakeside Court, West Palm Beach, Florida 33407. The name of the initial registered agent of this corporation at that address is Frederic T. DeHon, Jr.

#### ARTICLE VI Initial Board of Directors

This corporation shall have at least one director. The number of directors may be either increased or diminished from time to time by amendment to the Bylaws adopted by the stockholders. The name and address of the initial director of the corporation who, unless otherwise provided by the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws, shall hold office for the first year of existence of the corporation or until a successor is elected or appointed and has qualified is:

# ARTICLE VIII Bylaws

In furtherance and not in limitation of the powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida and the United States of America, the Board of Directors is expressly authorized to frame and adopt any such Bylaws for the corporation as are not inconsistent with the laws of the State of Florida or the United States of America or these Articles of Incorporation. With the exceptions of determining all matters regarding shareholders' meetings, notices, record dates, voting and actions without vote and fixing the number of directors of the corporation, the Board of Directors is expressly authorized, without the assent of the stockholders, to add to, delete from, or otherwise amend the Bylaws of the corporation.

# ARTICLE IX Indemnification and Limitation of Liability

The corporation shall indemnify any officer or director, or any former officer or director of the corporation, to the full extent permitted by law. payment of the corporate debts to any extent whatsoever. The corporation shall have a first lien on the shares of its stockholders and upon dividends due them for any indebtedness of such stockholders to the corporation.

# ARTICLE X Working Capital

The Board of Directors shall have the authority to fix any amount which in its discretion need be reserved as working capital of the corporation.

# ARTICLE XI Preemptive Rights

The corporation elects to have preemptive rights.

## ARTICLE XII Amendment

The corporation reserves the right to amend, add to, or repeal a provision contained in these Articles of Incorporation in the manner consistent with the law and in conformity with provisions set forth in the Bylaws.
