ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF INSULENE OF FLORIDA, INC.

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation under the Florida General Corporations Act, does hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

<u>Na</u>me

The name of the Corporation is INSULENE OF FLORIDA, INC.

ARTICLE II

Term of Corporate Existence

The period of duration of the Corporation is perpetual unless dissolved according to law.

ARTICLE III

<u>Purpose</u>

The purpose for which the Corporation is organized is:

- The corporation may transact any and all lawful business for which corporations may be incorporated under the Florida General Corporations Act.
- To purchase, sell, install and generally deal in insulation materials, products, supplies and services of all kinds related to the indoor enviornment; and to manufacture, own, operate and generally deal in and with all kinds of facilities and appurtenances convenient, desirable or necessary in the conduct and operation of the foregoing.
- 3. To acquire by purchase, or otherwise, for investment or resale, and to own, operate, subdivide, lease, let, mortgage, sell and otherwise dispose of, for cash or credit by conveyance, agreement for deed, or other lawful instrument, real estate, or mixed property, located in the State of Florida, or elsewhere, and generally to deal in and traffic as owner, agent or broker, in real estate, personal, and mixed property and any interest or estate therein, including subdivision, apartment houses, residences, stores, office buildings, manufacturing sights, and the lots or parcels of land upon which they may be located, and to create, own, lease, sell, operate and deal in freehold and leasehold estates of any and all character whatsoever, and to be an investor in real and personal property.

- 4. To lend and borrow money, be a surety, execute bail bonds and to execute and deliver, accept, take and receive notes, bonds, debentures or other evidences thereof, and mortgages, trust deeds, pledges, and other securities for the payment of same.
- 5. To acquire by purchase, subscription, or otherwise, and mortgage, pledge, or otherwise dispose of bonds, notes or other securities or evidences of indebtedness, and the shares of capital stock created and issued by any other corporation or corporations, association or associations, and to purchase, hold, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge, or otherwise dispose of any bonds or other securities or evidence created by or issued by any other corporation or corporations, associations, and while the owner of such stock, to exercise all rights, powers and privileges as such ownership, including the right to vote same, and to do any and all lawful acts or things designed to protect, preserve, improve, or enhance the value of any such bonds, stocks, or other securities or evidences of indebtedness and to guarantee dividends upon shares of the capital stock of any other corporation in which this corporation, at any time, may be interested as a stockholder thereof, and to endorse or otherwise guarantee the principal and interest, or either therefor, of notes, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness created by issue or such corporation; to deal in its own stock or brokerage business.

By-Laws

The Board of Directors shall adopt By-Laws for the Corporation, which may be amended, altered or repealed by the stockholders or directors in a manner permitted by the By-Laws.

ARTICLE X

Indemnification of Directors and Officers

The Corporation shall indemnify any director or officer made a party or threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suite or proceedings:

- 1. Whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, other than one by or in the right of the Corporation to procure a judgement in its favor, brought to impose a liability or penalty on such person or an act alleged to have been committed by such person in his capacity as director or officer of the Corporation, or in his capacity as director, officer, employee or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise which he served at the request of the Corporation, against judgements, fines, amounts paid in settlement and reasonable attorney's fees, actually and necessarily incurred as a result of such action, suite or proceeding or any appeal therein, if such person acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interest of the Corporation, and in criminal actions or proceedings, without reasonable grounds for belief that such action was unlawful. The termination of any such action, suite or proceedings by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not in itself create a presumption that any such director or officer did not act in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interest of the Corporation or that he had reasonable grounds for belief that such action was unlawful.
- 2. By or in the right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of his being or having been a director or officer of the Corporation, or by reason of his being or having been a director, officer, employee, or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise which he served at the request of the Corporation, against reasonable expenses, including attorney's fees, actually and necessarily incurred by him in connection with the defense or settlement of such action, or in connection with an appeal therein, if such person acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interest of the Corporation. Such person shall not be entitled to indemnification in relation to matters as to which such person has been adjudged to have been guilty of negligence or misconduct in the performance of his duty to the Corporation unless and only to the extent that the court, administrative agency, or investigative body before which such action, suite or proceeding is held shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability but in view of all circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnification for such expense which such tribunal deem proper.

Any indemnification under Section (1) shall be made by the Corporation only as such authorized in the specific case upon a determination that amounts for which the director or officer seeks indemnification were properly incurred and that such director or officer acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the Corporation, and that, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, he had no reasonable ground for belief that such action was unlawful. Such determination shall be made either (a) by the Board of Directors by majority vote of quorom consisting of directors who were not parties to such action, suite or proceeding, or (b) is such a quorum is not available, o even if obtainable, a quorom consisting of stockholders who were not parties to such action, suite or proceedings.

The foregoing rights of indemnification shall not be deemed to limit in any way the powers of the Corporation to indemnify under applicable law.

ARTICLE XI

<u>Amendment</u>

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in any manner now or hereafter provided by law, and all rights conferred upon stockholders hereunder are granted subject to this reservation.
