KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That the undersigned incorporators do hereby eritify they are forming a body corporate under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Florida for the transaction

of business with and under the following charter:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be: BULLS CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC.

ARTICLE II

The general nature of the business to be transacted by this corporation and its powers shall be
