To Whom It May Concern:

In March 1999, we were fortunate to get permission for keeping a company alive and maintaining employment for five (5) people by converting a subsidiary of a large corporation into a private and separate corporation (Resource Corporate Management, Inc.). The original parent was considering closing the subsidiary, however after much appealing, they allowed us to continue if we separated and we did so into a Corporate S. My concerns were the following:

- The staff of five (5) are young except for myself and we had no experience in the legal aspect of running a corporation.
- We had minimum capital and had to meet a payroll among many other unknown requirements as a separate entity
- Accounting, payroll, benefits and etc. need to be developed and handled or property outsourced by me since the other staff (four others) needed to concentrate on revenue development.
- To the best of my knowledge, we never received a notice that an annual payment and/or report was due to the state.

Immediate action taken

- Employed Crawford & Associates (law-firm) to incorporate us as a Florida Corporate S.
- Hired an accounting firm to handle financials, payroll, benefits, tax filing, and etc.
- Created a board of Directors with three internal officers (no fees) and one external member (lawyer) to help educate us and guide us on the proper way to run a corporation.
- Employed an insurance carrier to help us with evaluation and purchase of needed and affordable insurance.

Even with all these efforts, we <u>failed</u> to <u>understand</u> the need for an annual filing to the state and payment of the \$150.00 fee.

In June of 2001, I purchased a book on LLC Corps to compare to a Corp. S when I noticed a requirement for this filing. Being disturbed, I contacted our accountant, there had been no such filings, and they claimed no responsibility to do so. Immediately I discussed such with our legal member of the board and he agreed to contact the state and to date we are re-applying.

I'm requesting a waiver of the re-instatement fee (\$600.00) due to our intent has always been to do the right things however, did not understand the requirements. I realize ignorance is no excuse, but we are a <u>small</u> and <u>new</u> company that is still learning the ways of proper filings and are very disappointed in our CPA's for not informing us of the requirements and have since (May 2001) changed to another firm. This is the first time I have been involved with creating a corporation. I'm not trying to use that as an excuse but please understand we did not intentionally try to avoid filing.

I hope you will give us a strong consideration for a waiver since \$600.00 means a lot to us and we will not fail to submit the proper information in the future.
