ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

SAWGRASS PRINT & COPY CENTER, INC.

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation ander the Florida Business Corporation Act, does hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

<u>Name</u>

The name of this Corporation is:

SAWGRASS PRINT & COPY CENTER, INC.

Article II

Term of Corporate Existence

The period of duration of the Corporation is perpetual unless dissolved according to law.

ARTICLE III

Purpose

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

- (a) The Corporation may transact any and all lawful business for which corporations may be incorporated under the Florida General Corporation Act.
- (b) To acquire by purchase, or otherwise, for investment or resale, and to own, operate, subdivide, lease, let, mortgage, sell and otherwise dispose of, for cash or on credit by conveyance, agreement for deed, or other lawful instrument, real estate, or mixed property, located in the State of Florida, or elsewhere, and generally to deal in and traffic as owner, agent or broker, in real estate personal and mixed property and any interest or estate therein, including subdivision, apartment houses, residences, stores, office buildings, manufacturing sites, and the lots or parcels of land upon which they may be located, and to create, own, lease, sell, operate and deal in freehold and leasehold estates of any and all character whatsoever, and to an investor in real and personal property.

- (c) To lend and borrow money, be a surety, execute bail bonds and to execute and deliver, accept, take and receive notes, bonds, debenture or other evidences thereof, and mortgages, trust deeds, pledges, and or other securities for the payment of same.
- (d) To acquire by purchase, subscription, or otherwise, and mortgage, pledge, or otherwise dispose of bonds, notes or other securities or evidences of indebtedness, and the shares of capital stock created by or issued by any other corporation or corporations, association or associations, and while the owner of such stock, to exercise all rights, powers and privileges as such ownership, including the right to vote the same, and to do any and all lawful acts or things designed to protect, preserve, improve, or enhance the value of any such bonds, stocks, or other securities or evidences of indebtedness and to guarantee dividends upon shares of the capital stock of any other corporation in which this corporation, at any time, may be interested as a stockholder thereof, and to endorse or otherwise guarantee the principal and interest, or either thereof, of notes, bonds to deal in its own stocks or brokerage business.

Article IV

Authorized Shares

The aggregate number of shares which the Corporation is authorized to issue is 100 shares of Capital stock. Such shares shall be of a single class, and shall have a par value of ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00) per share.



Article XI

Indemnification of Directors and Officers

- 1. The Corporation shall indemnify any director or officer made a party or threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceedings:
- (a) Whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, other than one by or in the right of the Corporation to produce a judgement in its favor, brought to impose a liability or penalty on such person or an act alleged to have been committed by such person in his capacity as director or officer of the Corporation, on in his capacity as director, officer, employee or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise which he served at the request of the Corporation, against judgement, fines amounts paid in settlement and reasonable attorney's fees, actually and necessarily incurred as a result of such action, suit or proceeding or any appeal therein, if such person acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interest of the Corporation, and in criminal actions or proceedings, without the reasonable ground for belief that such action was unlawful. The termination of any such action, suit of proceedings by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere ioror its equivalent shall not in itself create a presumption that any such director or officer did hot act in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the the best interest of The Corporation of that he had reasonable grounds for belief that such action was unlawful. - (b) By or in the right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of his being or having been a director or officer -of the Corporation, or by reason of his being or having been a director, officer, employee, or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise which he served at the request of the Corporation, against reasonable expenses, including attorney's fee's, actually and necessarily incurred by him in connection with the defense or settlement of such action, or in commection with an appeal therein, is such person acted in good faith in the reasonable beleif that such action was in the best interests of the Corporation. Such person shall not be entitled to indemnification in relation to matters as to which such person has been adjudged to have been guilty or negligence of only to the extent that the court, administrative agency, or investigative body before which such action, suit or proceeding is held shall determine upon application, that, despite the adjudication of liability but in view of all circustances of the case, such person is fairly and resonable entitled to indemnification for such expenses whic such tribunal deem proper.
- 2. Any indemnification under Section (1) shall be made by the Corporation only as authorized in the specific case upon a determination that amount for which director or officer seeks indemnification were property incurred and that such director or officer acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonable beleived to be in the best interest of the Corporation, and that, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, he had no reasonable ground for beleif that such action was unlawful. Such determination shall be made either (a) by the Board of Director by a majority vote of quorum consisting of directors who were not parties to such action, suit or proceeding, or (b) if such quorum is not obtainable, or even if obtainable a quorum consisting of stockholders who were not parties to such action, suit or proceedings.
- 3. The foregoing rights of indemnification shall not be deemed to limit in any way the powers of the Corporation to indemnify under application law.

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in any manner now or hereafter provided by law, and all rights conferred upon stokcholders hereunder are granted subject to this reservation.
