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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF DOOR & DECOR, INC.

WE, the undersigned, hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of becoming a corporation under the laws of the State of Florida providing for the formation, liability, rights, privileges and immunities of a corporation for profit.

ARTICLE ONE

The name of the corporation shall be DOOR & DECOR, INC. The duration of existence of this corporation shall be perpetual, or until such time as said corporation is by due process of law, dissolved.

ARTICLE TWO

The general nature and objects of the business or businesses to be transacted by this corporation shall be any lawful activity or business permitted under the laws of the State of Florida or the United States of America:

- (a) To buy, sell, lease or rent a building in which to carry on its lawful activities under the Articles of Incorporation.
- (b) To purchase, receive, lease or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use and otherwise deal with real or personal property or any legal or equitable interest in property wherever located.
- To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, create a security interest in, lease, exchange and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property.
- (d) To lend money to, and use its credit to assist its officers and employees in accordance with Florida Statute 607.0833.
- (e) To purchase, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge or otherwise dispose of; and deal in and with shares or other interests in, or obligations of, any other entity;

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(f) To make contracts and gnarantees, incur liabilities, borrow money, issue its notes, bonds and other obligations (which may be converted into or include the option to purchase other securities of the corporation), and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of any of its property, franchises and income and make contracts of guaranty and suretyship which are necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion or attainment of the business of a corporation the majority of the outstanding stock of which is owned, directly or indirectly, by the contracting corporation, a corporation which owns, directly or indirectly, a majority of the outstanding stock of the contracting corporation; or a corporation the majority of the outstanding stock of which is owned, directly or indirectly; by a corporation which owns, directly or indirectly, the majority of the outstanding stock of the contracting corporation, which contracts of guaranty and suretyship shall be deemed to be necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion or attainment of the business of the contracting corporation, and make other contracts of guaranty and suretyship which are necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion or attainment of the business of the contracting corporation;

- (g) To lend money, invest and reinvest its funds; and receive and hold real and personal property as security for repayment;
- (h) To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, scientific or educational purposes;
 - To transact any lawful business that will aid governmental policy;
- (i) To make payments or donations or do any other act not inconsistent with law that furthers the business and affairs of the corporation;
- (k) To pay pensions and establish pension plans, pension trusts, profit-sharing plans, share bonus plans, share option plans, and benefit or incentive plans for any or all of its current or former directors, officers, employees and agents and for any or all of the current or former directors, officers, employees and agents of its subsidiaries;
- (I) To provide insurance for its benefit on the life of any of its directors, officers or employees or on the life of any shareholder for the purpose of acquiring at his death shares of its stock owned by the shareholder or by the spouse or children of the shareholder; and
- (m) To be a promoter, incorporator, partner, member, associate or manager of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other entity.
