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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

FREEDOM IV ENTERPRISES, INC.

The undersigned, desiring to form a corporation for profit under the laws of the State of Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of the corporation is FREEDOM IV ENTERPRISES, INC.

ARTICLE II: PRINCIPAL OFFICE OR MAILING ADDRESS

The principal office of the corporation is located at 4495-305 Roosevelt Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida 32210. The mailing address of the corporation is 4351 Garibaldi Avenue, Jacksonville, Florida 32210.

ARTICLE III: CAPITAL STOCK

- (a) Authorized Shares. The total number of shares that may be issued by the corporation is 100,000 having a par value of \$.10 per share. Each of the shares of stock shall entitle the holder thereof to one (1) vote at any meeting of the shareholders. All or any part of the capital stock may be paid for in cash or in property at a fair valuation to be fixed by the Board of Directors at a meeting called for such purpose. All stock when issued shall be paid fully for and shall be nonassessable.
- (b) <u>Capital Stock</u>. The capital of the corporation shall be at least equal to the sum of the aggregate par value of all issued shares having par value, plus such amounts as, from time to time, by resolution of the Board of Directors, may be transferred thereto.
- (c) <u>Corporate Liquidation and Dissolution</u>. In the event of voluntary or involuntary liquidation, dissolution or winding up of the corporation, the holders of record of the common stock shall be entitled to receive distribution, ratably, of the remaining assets of the corporation.
 - (d) <u>Preemptive Rights</u>. Shareholders shall have no preemptive rights.
 - (e) <u>Cumulative Voting</u>. Cumulative voting shall not be permitted.

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(f) <u>Restrictions on Transfer of Stock</u>. The shareholders may, by bylaw provision or by shareholders' agreement recorded in the minute book, impose such restrictions on the sale, transfer, or encumbrance of the stock of this corporation as they may see fit.

ARTICLE IV: INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The street address of the initial registered office of this corporation is One Independent Drive, Suite 2600, Jacksonville, Florida 32202, and the name of the initial registered agent of this corporation at that address is Mary A. Robison.

ARTICLE V: INCORPORATOR

The name and street address of the incorporator of this corporation are Mary A. Robison, One Independent Drive, Suite 2600, Jacksonville, Florida 32202.

ARTICLE VI: DIRECTORS

- (a) <u>Number</u>. The corporation shall have two directors initially. The number of directors may be changed from time to time by bylaws adopted by the shareholders.
- (b) <u>Initial Board of Directors</u>. The names and addresses of the initial board of directors until the first annual meeting of the shareholders, are as follows:

- (c) <u>Compensation</u>. The Board of Directors is hereby specifically authorized to make provision for reasonable compensation to its members for their services as directors, and to fix the basis and conditions upon which such compensation shall be paid. Any director of the corporation may also serve the corporation in any other capacity and receive compensation therefor in any form.
- (d) <u>Indemnification</u>. The Board of Directors is hereby specifically authorized to make provision for indemnification of directors, officers, employees and agents to the full extent permitted by law.

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ARTICLE VII: BYLAWS

ARTICLE VIII: DURATION

This corporation shall exist perpetually. Corporate existence shall commence on January 1, 2000, except that if the Articles of Incorporation are not filed by the Department of State of the State of Florida on or before such date, corporate existence shall commence upon filing by the Department of State.
