



UT is a National Weather Service-certified **StormReady®** University, and is one of more than 260 colleges and universities around the country that have put special operations in place to monitor and react to severe weather conditions, such as hurricanes, tornadoes and storms. UT uses a **campus-wide lightning prediction and warning system** to help alert the campus community about impending inclement weather and lightning on or around the UT campus. The system emits an audible horn blast when atmospheric weather conditions are imminently likely to produce dangerous lightning strikes on or around the UT campus. In these cases, the system will emit a 15-second warning blast and the strobe lights on the units will illuminate as long as there is danger of a potential strike. Once the lightning threat passes, three 5-second horn blasts will indicate an "all clear," and the strobe lights will turn off.

UT utilizes a technologically enhanced emergency communications program called **SMART (Spartan Mobile Alert)**. The program allows for speedy notification of emergencies on campus to students, faculty and staff. Emergency information is also posted on the UT website as soon as possible for updates to the general public.





PARKING POLICY HIGHLIGHTS

- Anyone parking a vehicle at The University of Tampa is required to register the vehicle and display the appropriate parking pass.
- Visitors are only required to have a parking pass Monday–Friday, 7 a.m.–5 p.m.
 or if the vehicle will be on campus overnight. Bring a driver's license and vehicle
 information, including plate number, to the Campus Safety office to obtain a
 parking pass.
- It is illegal to park anywhere on campus other than a clearly marked parking space. The absence of "No Parking" or "Fire Lane" signs, lack of curb paint, or enough room for a vehicle to park does not suggest that parking is permitted.
 Parking is not allowed on North A Street, Brevard Avenue or UT Poe Parkway for any reason. There are no exceptions.
- Parking rules are enforced year-round in order to ensure optimal parking availability for University community members and visitors to the campus.

VISITOR PARKING AREAS

- Thomas Parking Garage, First Floor Entrance is located on West North A Street, across from the Daly Innovation and Collaboration Building
- West Parking Garage, Second Floor
- Admissions guests may use the parking lots on UT University Drive by the Southard Family Building and the Macdonald-Kelce Library from 7 a.m.—5 p.m., and must obtain a pass from the Admissions Office. After 5 p.m. these lots are available to all visitors.
- Visitors to the Lowth Entrepreneurship Center may use the reserved spaces on the seventh floor of the Thomas Parking Garage. Visitors should enter the garage via Spaulding Drive, and must obtain a pass from Lowth Center staff.

BICYCLES ON CAMPUS

Students, faculty and staff can register their bikes with the Campus Safety office.

All bicycles should be properly locked to one of the bike racks on campus. Bike racks are located outside most residence halls and academic buildings. Campus Safety will impound all unsecured bikes.

DO NOT lock bicycles to any railings, doors, foliage or anywhere other than the bike racks. Otherwise the bike will be impounded by Campus Safety.
