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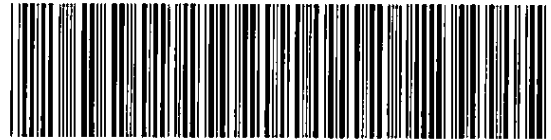

Helpline Programs

A gambling problem can negatively affect an individual's home life, financial status, career, education, social relationships, and physical and emotional health.



The 24 hour, multilingual, confidential **888-ADMIT-IT (236-4848)** (tel:+8882364848) Helpline offers a variety of free services to callers based on the needs of the individual. Callers are given the opportunity to share about the problems they are experiencing so they may be connected with the appropriate resources.

Resources available through the Helpline include:

- ✓ Referrals to self-help programs

Gamblers Anonymous (GA) is an anonymous and confidential fellowship of men and women of all ages, from diverse social and economic backgrounds, races and religions, who meet for the purpose of sharing their experience, strength and hope

as it relates to maintaining abstinence from gambling while living a happy and productive life. There are no dues or fees, and the only requirement for membership is a desire to stop gambling. Gamblers Anonymous offers a Pressure Relief Group that assists the gambler and family members in addressing financial, legal, and other problems. Pressure relief is typically performed after a gambler has participated in GA for a specified period, at which time a budget is devised and repayment plan is recommended.

Gam-Anon is for persons adversely affected by the gambler, such as family members and friends. Members are provided opportunities for learning how to cope with the gambler and accompanying difficulties. It is similar in structure and function to GA. It is not necessary for the gambler to attend Gamblers Anonymous in order for a family member, friend or other loved one to participate in the Gam-Anon program.

Celebrate Recovery (CR) is a faith based self-help program. It is based on the 8 Beatitudes of the bible and assists people with all addictions, hang ups and habits. CR also uses the steps as part of the recovery program. This program is also free to attend for anyone.

✓ Referrals to Certified Treatment Providers for private counseling

Within the State of Florida, there are trained and certified counselors providing supports to persons experiencing gambling related difficulties. Professional treatment differs from self-help groups in that it allows HelpLine callers the opportunity to share very personal information in a one-on-one dialogue with a trained specialist. Such treatment also provides an option of partaking as an individual, couple or participating in group counseling sessions. While there is a cost for professional treatment, the FCCG wants everyone one to know that regardless of their ability to pay, counseling is available through

Recovery Path (.Jget_help/recovery_path). Also, with the new DSM-5 classifying Gambling Disorder as an addictive behavior, some insurance companies will provide coverage for treatment. To be evaluated for Recovery Path or to be referred to a treatment professional, call the HelpLine directly at **888-ADMIT-IT (236-4848)**.

✓ Impaired Professional Assistance

Impaired professionals are individuals whose standing in the community could be jeopardized or compromised by attendance at public self-help meetings or group therapy (i.e. Doctors, Lawyers, Athletes, Celebrities, etc...). The FCCG has resources that can assist these individuals in a strictly confidential way.

✓ Financial and Legal supports

While the FCCG does not provide financial assistance to callers, there are resources that can help such as Credit Counseling referrals, Information regarding the Gamblers Anonymous Pressure Relief Group, and A Chance for Change workbooks where one of the books is dedicated to finances. Legal resources are also available as the FCCG refers to legal aid organizations.

✓ Self-Exclusion and Internet Blocking

Detailed information on the self-exclusion process at gambling facilities and referrals to ATM card blocking and Internet blockers that prohibit gambling websites to be accessed.

✓ Community Organizations, Hotlines, Social Services and much more

The FCCG has a directory of Alternative Support Groups, Mental Health Facilities, Crisis Centers, Social Service Organizations, Residential Treatment Centers, VA Clinics, Statewide Hotlines, and College Counseling Centers.

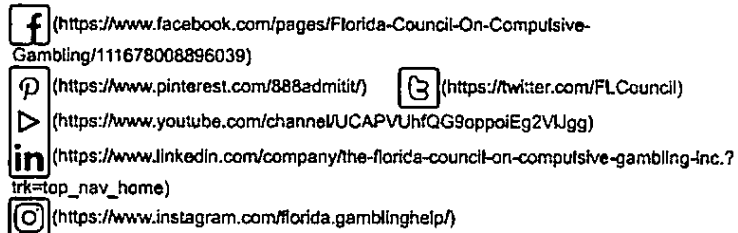

Compulsive gambling can have a devastating effect in any area of an individual's life. Of course, financial problems are the first thing that comes to mind but other areas such as work, relationships and mental health are also affected.

A compulsive gambler will do anything to stay in action even if it means neglecting family, missing work or depleting savings accounts. Oftentimes a compulsive gambler will resort to illegal activities to finance their gambling addiction (fraud, larceny and embezzlement are a few examples). This type of behavior can cause irreparable damage if not addressed as soon as possible.

Two Letters Make a Big Difference: Illegal Gambling Disguised in Florida as Arcade Gaming

Easily accessible, illegal gambling disguised as arcade gaming has spread to thousands of strip malls and stand-alone storefronts all over Florida. As a result, the FCCG's 888-ADMIT-IT Problem Gambling Helpline is experiencing a surge in contacts related to these shady establishments¹, sometimes referred to as "game rooms" or "gambling houses."

The arcades in question started springing up all over the Sunshine State in the early 2000s under the guise of "internet cafés." In 2013, a new law was passed to "give law enforcement authorities better tools to put an end to illegal gambling devices in strip malls and arcades throughout the state."² Even so, authorities struggled with effective enforcement – that is, until the Florida Gaming Control Commission (FGCC) was formed in 2021 and began mobilizing law enforcement to act on illegal gambling complaints fielded by consumers.³ FGCC tracks news about illegal gambling enforcement activities on its website.⁴ Today, Florida's laws are clear: Slot machines and slot simulations are illegal, outside the eight pari-mutuel facilities in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties and at tribal facilities.

Slot machines are strictly regulated by FGCC and are legal only in the eight pari-mutuel facilities in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties and at tribal facilities.

The impacts illegal gambling establishments are having on patrons and employees, who may not otherwise gamble or would not make the drive to a slot-licensed facility, have grown exponentially and are of particular concern to older adults. It's why AARP and the FGCC are teaming up to issue warnings saying these operators are specifically targeting vulnerable aging populations. "When they open up in a neighborhood, they dial up the winnings to entice the neighborhood to come in and play. Once they get a packed house, they can literally dial down the winnings to almost zero. Then at that point, they're just stealing and using predatory practices and taking money from Florida's most vulnerable, especially the senior population," said Eric Carr, the FGCC's Director of External Affairs.⁵ On top of that, players often do not realize the establishments are illegal and often become magnets for crime.

Most concerning of all, illegal gambling establishments are breeding grounds for gambling problems. Though most who gamble can do so safely, the tables are turned when predatory practices are combined with a lack of even basic consumer protections, such as signage for the 888-ADMIT-IT Problem Gambling Helpline or facility staff training to identify concerning signs and respond appropriately; a tenet of the FCCG's Responsible Gambling and Player Protection Program (RGPPP) in place at Florida's slot-licensed facilities. An individual suffering from problem gambling will do anything to stay in the action, even if it means continuing to gamble at an illegal arcade which has cheated them time and time again.

The FCCG offers a broad range of training services to various professional organizations and furnishes such instruction via field experts.

RESPONSIBLE GAMING AND PLAYER PROTECTION PROGRAM

Facility, Employee and Train-the-Trainer Modules

The intent of a Responsible Gaming Program is to empower casino operators to devise a plan and related protocols to address varying situations that will emerge when encountering guests who are experiencing problems because of gambling. One of the roles of the FCCG is to assist the gambling industry in establishing customer and employee based problem gambling awareness programs. The FCCG's *Responsible Gaming and Player Protection Program (RGPPP)* is a step-by-step comprehensive guide that helps the gaming industry navigate its way through conducting a self-assessment, devising an organizational philosophy, establishing an administrative and internal program structure, and developing problem and compulsive gambling policies and protocols.

Responsible gaming training and ongoing employee education is mandated by Florida statute for all state slot machine licensees. The FCCG has developed new hire and annual refresher training to help facilities adhere to the necessary regulations, and in turn provide an exceptional level of support for your patrons and employees. Casino employees are the eyes and ears of your daily operations and are often the first point of contact or first responder to guests. While employees are not counselors, they do provide liaison support to assure that patrons get the help they need while on the casino property. Gaming industry employees are known to be in the high risk group and are 5-10 times more likely to develop gambling problems than the general gambling

population. For this reason, it is important for facility employees to have knowledge of resources for help specific for gaming industry staff available by internal and external programs/resources.

Currently the FCCG offers an online training module for all new hire trainings. *Improving the Odds* is an effective tool meant to save you time, while ensuring the necessary state regulations for employee training are met.
